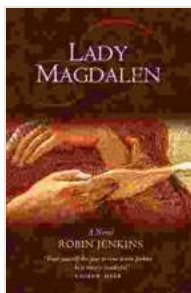


Lady Magdalen Bernard Knight: A Trailblazing Champion of Justice and Equality

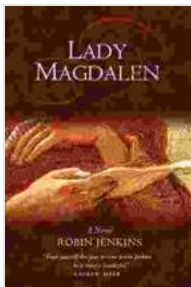

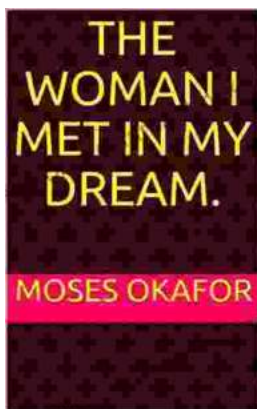
